 - ✓ Novice registration numbers remained strong.
 - ✓ Next year will see the introduction of the IP5-6 and the IP7
 program. Which will see 5-6-year old's play cross ice and 7-year
 old's play half ice

 - ✓ It was an exciting year for bantam and peewee. We had player evaluations at the beginning which helped with our team balancing at the beginning of the year. We have collected coach's evaluations at the end of this year to help us even better with the balancing of next year.
 - ✓ We had house league teams going to the Walter Gretzky tournament and Jordan station tournament, representing BCHL very well with both teams making it to the quarter finals and semifinals. Next year we will encourage other HL teams to represent BCHL in other HL tournaments.
